Following discussions, it was agreed that Clerk should write again, to the owner of the fence explaining that due to safety concerns it must be removed to ensure that no injury is caused, should the fence fall due to its dilapidated state and as previously suggested by the land owner, close the path and prevent access until the fence has been removed.

### 51. Community Governance Review of the boundary between Lapworth and Rowington Parishes

Councillor D Weir asked members to consider emailing Graham Leach, Head of Governance & Monitoring Officer regarding the proposal from Lapworth PC for a Community Governance Review.

The PC objects strongly to the proposed review, as do residents that have been consulted. It is considered a waste of public money and the impact of a Boundary Review has not been given proper consideration by Lapworth PC. There are wider implications for Kingswood as a whole, not just the small area that Lapworth wish to absorb into their parish, following the request by Lapworth Councillors Hall & Beever, who live in Lapworth, with a Lapworth address but are concerned that they are within Rowington Parish.

It was resolved that the Clerk should write to Graham Leach and include comments that had been received from residents.

### 55. Community Infrastructure Levy Funds (CIL)

Drainage on Playing Field

Following a request from the Clerk, Councillor D Weir had received a quotation from Fairways to carry out necessary drainage works on the playing field, which was considered by members.

Sand slits at 2m centres 50mm wide and 300mm deep across the recreation ground staying around 5m away from the trees along either side to avoid root damage and extending approximately 90m up the field from the ditch to roughly the location of the horse chestnut will cost £7,985

Remove all timber fencing from the concrete fence posts directly in front of the ditch, break out one leaning post and reset it vertically. Replace the three timber rails across the entire length of the fence and then attach stock proof fencing to the rails to restore the security of the fence to prevent access to the land behind will cost £2,650

To clean out the ditch with a mini-digger and remove trees from within the ditch to create an unencumbered escape towards the adjacent pond for water arising from the sand slits will cost £1,150.

Resolved unanimously that the works should take place later in the year to ease the continued flooding of the land.

#### **Report from District Councillors**

South Warwickshire Local Plan

The Advisory Group continues to meet regularly and received a briefing on the Playing Pitch Strategy, with recommendations for the new facilities required across the plan period, as well as the upgrading of existing playfields. An update was also received on the new housing requirements, slightly higher than previously advised. The growth strategy was discussed with the process now moving to Stage 2, testing, which will be completed by: consultation analysis, liaison with infrastructure providers, and liaison with promoters. Masterplans are to be commissioned for South Warwickshire's main towns and this is likely to add a small delay to the start of the next consultation, probably April 2026. The timetable for final submission remaining unchanged from that previously published i.e. December 2026.

#### Free trees for Farmers

Trees play a vital role in our environment e.g. improving air quality, providing shade and cooling during hot weather, reducing surface water runoff and preventing soil erosion.

In addition to planting trees on council-owned land, WDC is working in partnership with Warwickshire Wildlife Trust to support tree planting on suitable sites through the Free Trees for Farmers scheme and Community Tree and Hedge Planting scheme. - 1. 9 June application window opens.
- 2. 20 July application window closes.
- 3. 23 July to 10 August officers process applications, including due diligence checks and scoring.
- 4. 11 August to 29 August officers discuss applications with Councillors individually, and Councillors decide on awards.
- 5. 1 September to 5 September decisions are shared with applicants.
